The exaggerated proportions of the **390series** are an ode to the distinctive early stretched Roman bricks. Long and clean, they add textural variance to pared-back sculptural architecture. Available in a sophisticated industrial colour palette.

## How to Choose a Brick

Colour of the brick. Colour of the mortar. Size of the brick. Texture of the brick.

We know that when our customers choose bricks, it is predominately on colour. But more importantly we know this choice cannot be made in isolation. Designers use a scale known as “60, 30, 10”, it’s simply a definition for the proportions of a design space.

60% - For the facade of your home this is the exterior wall, the largest proportion of your design space has the largest impact.

30% - For the façade of your home this is the roof.

10% - For the façade of your home this is the gutter, fascia, joinery and doors.

Four Steps To Selecting An Exterior Colour Scheme.

- 1) Choose brick colour
- 2) Choose mortar colour and style
- 3) Choose roof
- 4) Selecting the fascia, gutter, joinery and doors to complete the picture

## Mortar Colour

When it comes to mortar (what binds the bricks together) you will need to consider the colour and finish, as both will have a striking impact on the look of your bricks. Mortar constitutes approximately 15% of the brick facade colour. An off-white mortar between darker coloured bricks will add contrast and highlight the shape of each brick. Whereas matching mortar colour to the brick will soften the brickwork. Please confirm with your builder or brick layer what their mortar colouring offering is before you make your final decision. When using a mortar that is not a prebagged trade mortar, only washed river sand should be used. Warranties for efflorescence are voided if sea sand is used.

A rolled joint is recommended for the 390series bricks.

## Bond Pattern

A bond is the pattern in which bricks are laid. The most common bond is Stretcher Bond which consists of courses of full bricks where every course is offset half a brick from the course below. Stacked and Flemish are also popular and achieve an alternative look.
